Year 8	Caribbean Music	Reggae Pt.1	Reggae Pt.2	Indian Music	African Drumming	The Blues
	Pupils will learn about a variety of styles of music from the Caribbean. They will learn a range of melodic and rhythmic musical parts in order to arrange a group performance of a traditional Caribbean song. Pupils will assess the outcomes of these performances. Writing / Speaking / Performing (Group performance)	Part 1 of this unit offers pupils a chanceto gain an understanding of the origins and history of Reggae music. They will arrange a group performance of 'Stir It Up' by Bob Marley as part of an ongoing assessment. Writing / Speaking / Performing (Group performance)	Part 2 of the Reggae unit looks at developing pupils' knowledge of the genre in order to create their own Reggaecompositions. These areto be performed in groups and analysed as part of a peer assessment. Writing / Reading (Musical notation) / Group Performance	This unit explores the music of India. Pupils will study keyfeatures, instruments and styles in order to create an Indian classical composition. Pupils will develop their understanding of structure, form and advanced rhythm. Writing / Reading / Group performance	Pupils will be able to understand, identify and describe the key features of African Music. They will use this knowledge to recognise these key features in listening extracts and take part in group activities. Pupils will create their own African drumming composition in small groups. Writing / Listening / Group performance	This unit explores the origins of Blues and its impact on other musical styles. Pupils will engage in a variety of listening and practical tasks, which culminates in a group performance of 'Rock Around the Clock'. Pupils will develop their ability to improvise. 	Pupils will learn about the key musical features of one of the earliest forms of music. They will apply their musical knowledge in order to compose and perform a piece of music which uses the rules of Gregorian Plainchant. They will then learn to employ modern musical techniques in order to 'remix' their composition.	Pupils will begin to study Minimalist music. They will learn about its impact within art and music, as well as its later application within music written for film and TV. Pupils will engage in a group performance of a prominent Minimalist composition. Writing / Listening / Group Performance	Pupils will gain an understanding of, interpret and analyse key features of Film music. They will analyse a range of music written for films and improve their ability to answer questions on unfamiliar pieces of music. They will learn to perform a famous piece of film music in small groups. Writing / Speaking / Performing (Group performance)	Pupils will gain an understanding of the origin and history of Funk & Disco music. They will arrange a group performance of 'Play That Funky Music' by Wild Cherry as part of an ongoing assessment. Writing / Reading (Musical notation) / Solo performance	Pupils will apply their knowledge of Funk & Disco in order to create and perform their own Dance/House style compositions. These will be analysed and assessed. Students will be introduced to elements of music technology during this unit. Writing / Reading / Group performance / Music technology	This final unit focuses on modern popular music. Pupils learn about the key elements of a variety of popular songs. They will learn to perform parts of a popular song within a group setting. Previous performances have included songs by Jonas Blue, Camila Cabello, Post Malone, Alicia Keys and The Weeknd.
