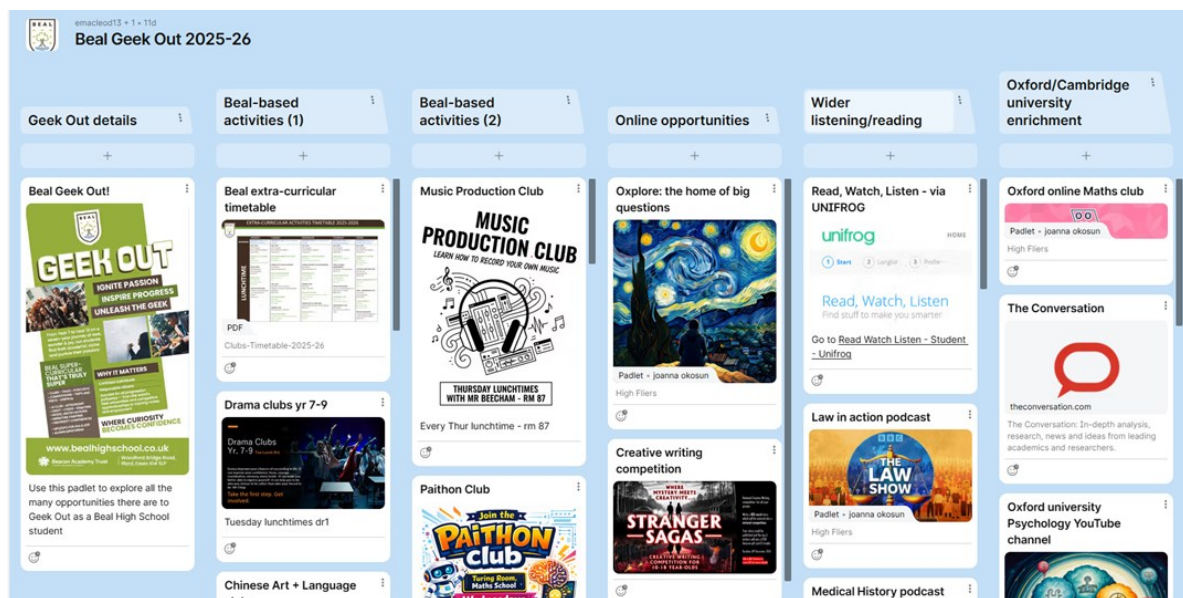




Geek Out Padlet

Parents, you can support this over the Easter break by discussing the opportunities on the Padlet with your child and encouraging them to try activities that spark genuine interest.



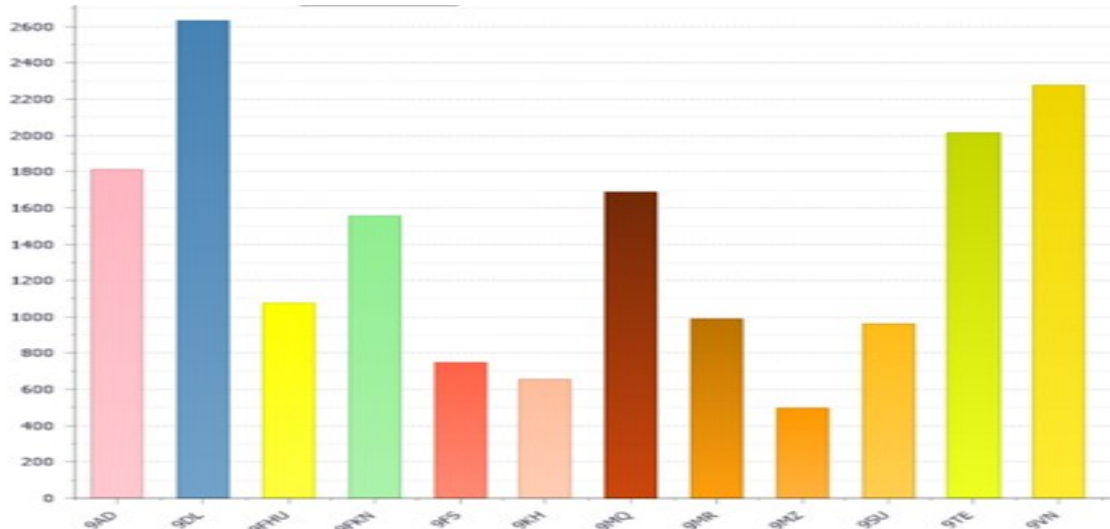
Assemblies

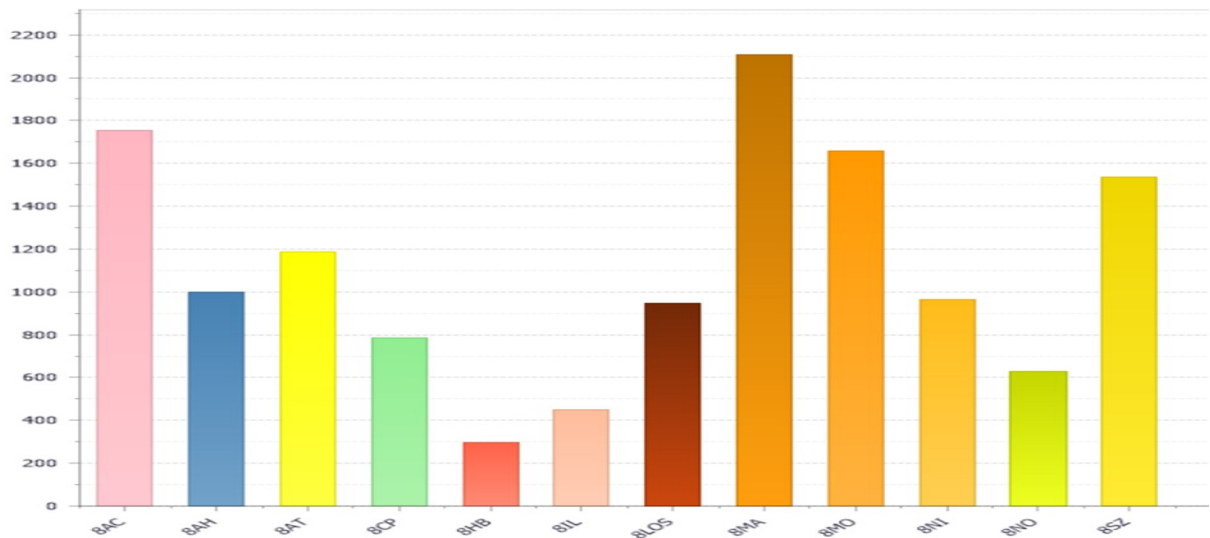

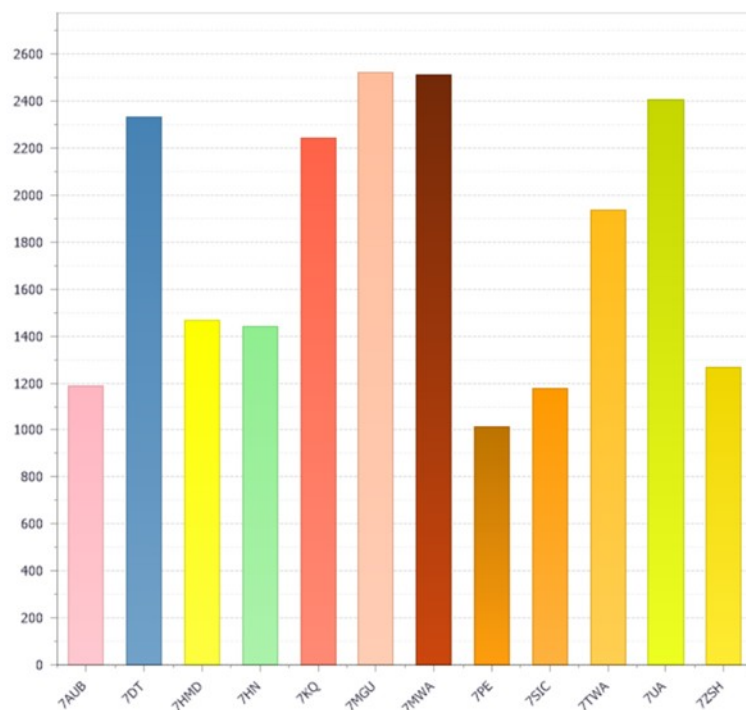
